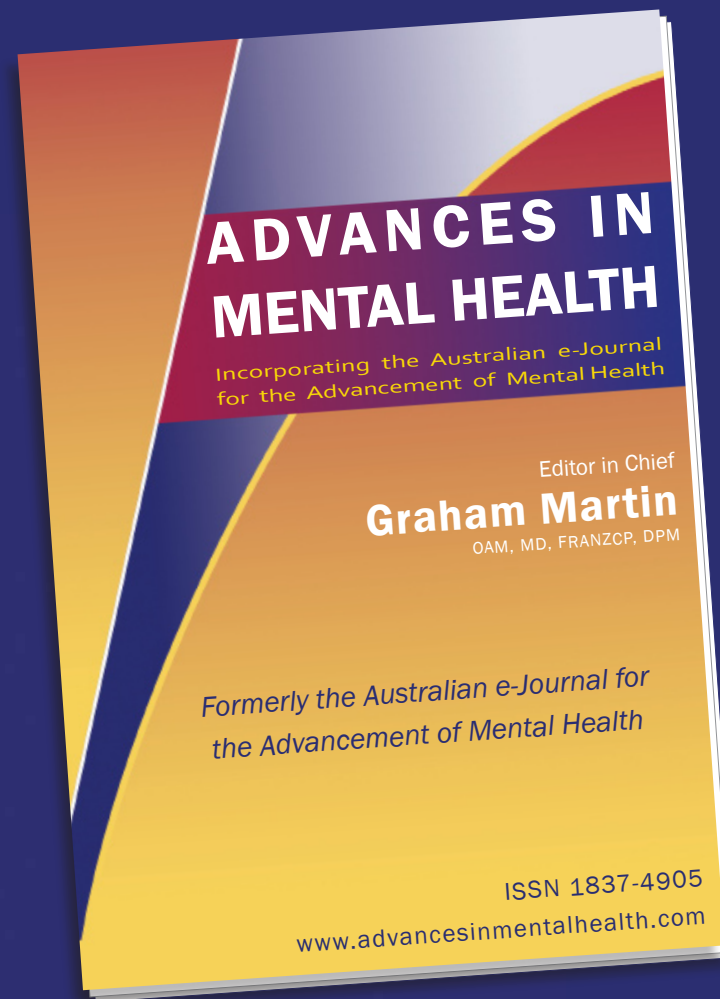

- Mental health nursing


